

### Center for Transboundary Water Management (CTWM) Internship

The CTWM intern will work in the CTWM center on several projects that are currently in progress, along with other projects that may occur during the duration of the internship.

CTWM works at the intersection of science and policy on shared waters between Israel and the Palestinian Authority and between Israel and Jordan and among Israel, Jordan and the Palestinian Authority. The work of the center focuses particularly on the following:

- Regional water policy for the Jordan River and Dead Sea basin
- Cross-border stream restoration
- Cross-border wastewater management and reuse
- Appropriate water technologies for off-grid rural and urban communities
- Regional water economics and modeling

#### Qualifications – Essential

- First degree essential in one of the following: environmental studies, environmental policy, environmental engineering.
- Strong organizational and time management skills
- Affinity for field work
- Computer proficient (Microsoft Office, Excel, Word, PowerPoint, etc.)
- Excellent written and oral English a must, command of either Hebrew or Arabic is an advantage
- Pleasant and personable, hardworking, efficient, able to work under pressure and for long hours.
- Ability to work independently,

#### Qualifications – preferable

- Interested in meeting people from many countries and cultures. Willing to take on major responsibilities and to carry out mundane tasks as well.
- Knowledge of GIS
- Graduates with a Master degree.

#### Responsibilities

Depending on the project the intern will work on the responsibilities may differ but all work will require strong attention to detail, the ability to work independently and as part of a group, the

ability to coordinate complex projects and diverse stakeholders. Once the intern has indicated an interest for a project, specific responsibilities will be coordinated with the intern supervisor.

### Conditions of Internship

- The Institute will provide living arrangements including food, housing, health insurance and laundry services at the AIES campus. The intern may be placed in a room with another Institute intern or with an AIES student, living on the AIES campus.
- This is a self-funded position covering room, board, and program participation. The cost is \$1500 per month.
- The Institute will reimburse the intern for all expenses incurred due to job requirements including the use of a personal cell phone and travel expenses.
- The intern must own a laptop and have a cell phone.
- The intern will be allowed to attend special guest lectures and participate in field trips and campus life activities.
- The intern will be expected to participate in general staff meetings and certain staff activities
- The intern will be required to participate in staff office maintenance rotation (toranut)
