Zack is an Arava Alumnus from spring semester 2000. Since that time Zack has continued on a career path focused on environmental health. Currently, he is a Senior Environmental Specialist for New York University working in NYU's Environmental Health & Safety department. At NYU Zack manages Industrial Hygiene (i.e. environmental exposure issues), Hazardous Waste, Indoor Air Quality, Water Quality, Ergonomics, and environmental health and safety government compliance for the university as a whole. Zack also sits on NYU's Sustainability Task Force and contributes to sustainability initiatives as a member and advisor on various sub-committees. Zack was also a senior scientific advisor to the sustainability start up company Partnership for the Environment, which had developed a sustainability certification system for restaurants. Zack graduated from Rutgers University's School of Environmental and Biological Sciences with a Bachelor of Science in Environmental Policy, Institutions, and Behavior. Zack also has a Masters of Public Health in Environmental and Occupational Health from Hunter College.

Zack has fond memories from the Institute, thanks in large part to his roommates. One of them was Mohammed "Hamoody" Atwa, a Palestinian from Gaza. At first they were both shy around each other; as Zack put it, "Hamoody was the epitome of 'the other' for me." But before long, they began talking, exchanging narratives, and fully recognizing one another as people rather than stereotypes. Zack even had the opportunity to visit Gaza with Hamoody and stay with his family. Later, when Hamoody traveled to the US, Zack was able to return the favor by bringing Hamoody to dinner with his own family. Today, Zack and Hamoody remain friends and both hold leadership positions in the North American Arava Alumni Network.

Zack's experiences at the Institute were sometimes challenging, a sentiment most alumni can identify with. As he says, "The questions that came up about identity and dual narratives were very hard ones. But it is essential to ask those questions if we want the chance for peace."

Zack's passion for the Arava Institute has not dwindled in the decade since his time there. "The Arava Institute touched me in a profound and everlasting way," he states. Zack has maintained a strong connection to the Arava Institute through his involvement in the <u>North American Arava</u>

On-Campus Greywater System Nears Completion



Did you know that construction of a greywater treatment system has been happening at the Arava Institute? In July, the major construction components of the greywater treatment and reuse system for the new JNF Mountain State Region dorms were finally

complete. This system is connected to two units in these new student dorms, and will be a test site to monitor the system's treatment capacity and efficiency.

Six more similar systems will be constructed as part of the USAID-Conflict Management and Mitigation funded project – entitled "Mitigating Trans-boundary Wastewater Conflict" in the coming six months. Four of these systems will be built in Palestine and two in Israel. The institute is proud to have the first site built on Ketura at the dorms, allowing the researchers, interns, and students to continuously study, test and optimize the system for future implementation in rural decentralized households which are not connected to any wastewater infrastructure.
