## LAST YEAR AT A GLANCE

Despite the heartbreak of the war and its tremendous obstacles to peacebuilding, the Institute held strong in the three pillars of our mission:

- ▶ We piloted and hosted workshops on **cutting-edge green technologies for off-grid communities**, including unrecognized Bedouin villages in the Negev.
- ▶ Our **grassroots environmental diplomacy** grew across borders and our partnerships enabled us to stay strong; we have not lost any Palestinian or Jordanian partners.
- ▶ Our **students and interns remained on campus and persevered** in learning together despite their fears and losses. Our **alumni applied the peacebuilding skills** they learned at the Institute to uniting people throughout the region.

## The Arava Institute and Friends of the Arava Institute are proud to have celebrated distinct successes this past year:

- We set up the **first solar-powered classroom in Israel** with an unrecognized off-grid Bedouin village in the Negev.
- Institute staff participated in the **United Nations Climate Change conference in Dubai**, where they forged connections and presented in the Israel pavilion. This was the first year that the Institute had its own delegation under our official NGO observer status.
- A sold-out event **honoring the immeasurable impact of Friends of the Arava Institute's CEO emerita, Miriam May**, raised over \$300,000 for the Institute with special guest Mandy Patinkin.
- Responding to the war in Gaza, the Institute launched **Jumpstarting Hope in Gaza** to supply lifesaving off-grid water, sanitation, and energy technology to civilians affected by the war.



# International Recognition of Our Leadership

Dr. Tareq Abu Hamed, Executive Director of the Arava Institute for Environmental Studies, received the **2024 AAAS David and Betty Hamburg Award for Science Diplomacy** for his leadership in using science to build relationships across the Middle East, particularly between Israelis and Palestinians.

First established in 1992 as the International Scientific Cooperation Award, the award recognizes an individual or a small group working together in the scientific, engineering, or foreign affairs communities that are making an outstanding contribution to furthering science diplomacy.

The Arava Institute was also honored to have its transboundary work in environmental diplomacy recognized with a **Nobel Peace Prize nomination** this year. A group of international academics nominated the Institute for its contributions to regional cooperation, education, and environmental diplomacy in the Middle East for the last twenty-eight years.

“Our fates are connected. At the Institute, we believe that a different future, one that embraces cycles of trust, justice, empathy, and compassion, is possible and achievable for Palestinians and Israelis,” read a statement after October 7th.



## Wartime Challenges of Environmental Peacebuilding

Executive Director Dr. Tareq Abu Hamed emphasized to the Jerusalem Press Club earlier this year that **no one wins in a war**. The only way to stop this cycle of violence—this cycle of war—he said, is to hold dialogue for understanding and to build trust to find the just peace that we all seek.

Recruitment of students from the Middle East became increasingly difficult. To expand our reach, the Institute recently hired a full-time recruiter focusing specifically on outreach to Palestinian Israeli citizens. The unpredictable nature of the war also impacted international recruitment efforts as universities limited study abroad in Israel. Yet, each semester, the Institute continued to attract applicants from the region and the world and hosted geographically diverse cohorts.

Initially, cross-border research was on pause but our communication lines remained open, if strained. We were unable to host conferences in person in Israel, but we adapted and held conferences in Cyprus, enabling us to bring together international and regional partners.

# Academic Program

**Israeli, Palestinian, American, Kenyan, Guatemalan, German, South African and Moroccan students joined us during the 2023–2024 academic year.**

The fall 2023 semester of our university-accredited program began a month before the war. We paused the program only for a few days and most of the students chose to remain on campus, where they continued to learn and support each other.

**Fall semester trips** took students to environmental research and development centers as well as to local Bedouin communities. During the spring semester, the three-day trip included a Bedouin school in the Negev, the Jewish/Arab communal village

Jerusalem. As always, these

trips broadened student

experiences. Several of our

Jewish students had never

visited East Jerusalem

or the Muslim quarter

of the Old City and while

initially apprehensive,

they came away believing

it deepened their

understanding of their

friends.

The **Dialogue Forum**, a required non-credited weekly seminar, provided a safe space for our students to develop skills to engage in civil dialogue and compassionate

listening. During the fall graduation program, the students performed an emotional song about peace, delivered in Hebrew, Arabic, and English, written by two participants who were called up for reserve duty and returned to their friends on campus.

# Teaching Peace

The academic program staff found that students were thirsty for the opportunity to continue to learn. They came to the Institute with hope for a better tomorrow.

In the midst of this, the Institute's rigorous academic curriculum added three new courses and reintroduced one to the spring semester curriculum:

- **Changing the Intellectual Climate:** A journey into the new vocabularies of global environmental change
- **Conflict and Cooperation:** An interdisciplinary exploration of environmental relations in the Middle East
- **Green Building & Socio-Economic Values**
- **Water and Economics:** Applying the Multi-Year Water Allocation System (MYWAS) model



# Working Regionally for Climate Resilience

## The New Center for Climate Change Policy & Research

Our new Center for Climate Change Policy and Research, led by Dr. Elise Machline, integrates the Arava Institute's various research disciplines using a multidisciplinary approach to face the challenges posed by climate change. The Center's working groups include researchers from throughout the region pursuing food security, public health, eco-districts, and transboundary water management research. Under the leadership of Dr. Machline, the Center worked to organize region-wide responses to the impact of climate change, despite the challenges of meeting during the war.

## Applied Environmental Diplomacy

The Arava Institute applies the lessons of cross-border environmental cooperation to facilitate practical, on-the-ground projects through civil society cooperation between Israel, Palestine, and Jordan to improve lives, protect the environment, and support sustainable resolution of conflict. During this past year, this Center began to work on:

- **Jumpstarting Hope in Gaza**, launched and led with Palestinian partner Damour for Community Development. They are an international multi-sector coalition, working to bring our environmental expertise to rapidly deploy water and wastewater treatment, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH) solutions, as well as energy solutions, providing immediate relief to Gazan civilians in Green Refugee Shelters while long-term strategies are in development.
- **Harvesting Cooperation**, funded by USAID, is an initiative to bring Water, Energy, Food and Ecosystems (WEFE) pilot projects and training programs to Israeli, Palestinian and Jordanian communities concurrently.



# Partnering with Unrecognized Bedouin Villages

Off-grid technologies use renewable energy and are not reliant on an electrical grid or sewage systems. In Israel, roughly 1/3 of the 300,000 Bedouin in Israel live off-grid and do not have access to clean drinking water or electricity. The Institute's applied research centers are developing off-grid technologies to bring environmental solutions to communities like the Bedouin. We also provide capacity-building training so that communities understand their value and learn how to use and maintain these technologies.

- **Solar Energy for Bedouins** | The Arava Institute hosted a seminar in August on “Solar energy as a catalyst for regional development in the Bedouin community” in cooperation with the Bedouin Society for Off-Grid and Unrecognized Villages in the Eastern Negev region. This seminar is part of a series of lectures, trainings, and capacity building activities run by the Institute since January 2023. The series aims to provide sustainable solutions for renewable energy, water conservation and production, wastewater treatment, agriculture, and a circular economy.
- **The first Bedouin Climate Justice conference** in December in Segev Shalom discussed renewable energy solutions in Bedouin settlements and covered issues of safety during the war for the Bedouin community. This work is led by Fareed Mahameed, who is an alum and the Assistant Director of the Institute's Center for Transboundary Water Management.
- In May, a **Solar Program for Women**, a first-ever workshop for Israeli Bedouin and Palestinian women interested in exploring the fundamentals of practical and theoretical aspects of solar energy, covered topics including sources to acquire necessary permissions and funding to implement solar power for their home, as well as hands-on workshops to enhance their practical skills.
- **The Off-Grid Hub for Climate Resiliency** is a pedagogical hub at a Bedouin high-school in al-Furaa that serves 1,200 students and will be a model for off-grid communities that lack wastewater treatment infrastructure. These are the first and only off-grid classrooms in Israel. Students will learn about hi-tech innovative sustainability through 5 technologies: wastewater treatment, solar power, conversion of waste into energy for cooking and heating (biodigesters), atmospheric water generation to create drinking water from moisture in the air, and community gardens using recycled water.



## Environmental Research

**Agrivoltaics** | Our Center for Renewable Energy and Energy Conservation, led by Dr. Tali Zohar, is piloting the harvesting of crops using an Agrivoltaic system (AgriPV), where crops are grown directly under solar panels. New AgriPV plots were installed on the Arava Institute campus, where we harvested crops including tomatoes and sweet potatoes. This technology may help farmers at risk of losing their farms due to increased droughts.

**Supplying Wastewater Treatment Technology in the West Bank** | The Institute is partnering to supply our patented wastewater treatment and reuse system, Laguna Innovation, as well as large-scale biogas digesters, to support a dairy operation in the West Bank. This system treats the sewage from the milking parlor for reuse. It also uses cow manure to extract biogas, which produces electricity to run the boilers in the dairy.

**Ancient Judaeen Dates** | In August, we harvested our world famous ancient dates for the 4th year. Hannah is our only fruit-bearing Ancient Judaeen date tree as of now. The tree was sprouted from a 2,000 year-old seed, and pollinated by Methuselah, another Ancient Judaeen date tree. This harvest of these ancient dates is the continuation of an ambitious, decades-long experiment to raise the biblical-era *Phoenix dactylifera* – date palm – from the dead.

# International Partnerships and Conferences

**The Arava Institute participates regionally and globally as we continue to expand and develop our international partnerships beyond the United Nations:**

In September 2023, the Arava Institute partnered with the **Environmental Change Institute of the University of Oxford** on a joint project to build resilience to climate change through citizen-led energy transition in Israel and the UK, generously supported by the British Council Wohl Clean Growth Alliance Grants.

The Arava Institute's Center for Climate Change Policy and Research held its first convening at the **Cyprus Institute**, launching a partnership with the Cyprus Institute's Eastern Mediterranean Middle East Climate Change Initiative.

The Arava Institute's Center for Transboundary Water Management completed its partnership with **GREENinMED**, an EU-funded transboundary project with partners from Spain, France, and Israel that aimed to increase water and energy efficiency and sustainability in the Mediterranean tourism industry. Eleven hotels

in Israel were selected to receive free consultations on how to improve their water and energy efficiency.

## Alumni Programs

Alumni engagement is an integral part of our mission. The Institute recently established the Fund for Entrepreneurship and Creativity. Through seed grants, the Institute provides financial and capacity building support for alumni to harness the skills they develop at the Institute to launch new endeavors. These funds enable alumni to start cross-cultural business and social initiatives and to create a network of relationships that support sustainability and stability in the Middle East.

- **Mazra'ah Community** | Promoting Jewish - Bedouin friendship and cooperation around environmental sustainability
- **Fostering Israeli-Palestinian Cross-Border Environmental Cooperation and Innovation** | Empowering activists navigating tumultuous times, fostering resilience, and providing practical tools for personal growth
- **Thayalu** | Teaching Arabic language and culture to Jewish Israeli children
- **Masafer Sustainable Footwear** | Supporting the artisan Palestinian shoemaking market

- During the **Alumni Palooza** held at the Institute in May, 15 alumni came back to the campus to meet with the current students and interns and share their experiences, expertise, and projects over the years. Many work in environmental and peacebuilding fields. During these challenging times, their commitment to transboundary environmental cooperation and activism shows there are true partners for peace in the Middle East.
- A group of Palestinian and Israeli Arava Institute alumni created the **Whatsapp group “Voices of Solidarity”** in the fall to share messages promoting peace and solidarity during the ongoing war. The goal of the group is to “work together to change the current violent and segregated discourse around us, to one of protection of innocent civilians, and dialogue, and to amplify the voices of those who want to live together, know how to live together, and are learning to live together.”



## ENGAGING COMMUNITIES BEYOND THE REGION

Dr. Tareq Abu Hamed and Institute faculty visited communities throughout the United States and spoke both virtually and in person. For those unable to meet in person, Friends of the Arava Institute continued its series of online programs called "Voices on the Ground," discussing the challenges of environmental peacebuilding during wartime:

- **Teaching during Times of War**, with Arava Institute faculty member Dr. Miri Lavi-Neeman and Academic Director Dr. Jessica Schackermann.
- **Institute Briefing**, with Dr. David Lehrer, who spoke about the current situation on the ground and how the Institute envisions the possibility of future cooperation through our applied environmental diplomacy work.
- **Cultivating Coexistence and Hope through Environmental Dialogue**, with Dr. Tareq Abu Hamed at Central Synagogue in New York.
- **Communities of Hope: The Hostage and Missing Families Forum and the Arava Institute**, with Ambassador Daniel Shek, Arava Institute Board member.

## Scholarly Output

Despite the challenges of the war, faculty members and research staff presented at conferences and seminars and kept publishing in 2023–4. Highlights include:

- **International Environmental Leadership |** Executive Director Dr. Tareq Abu Hamed presented in Greece at the Sparta Symposia of Ideas in August: “Towards a sustainable ecosystem.” Dr. Abu Hamed presented on the role of environmental diplomacy in advancing regional Water–Energy–Food nexus initiatives.
- **Viral Presence of Covid in Wastewater |** Wastewater can be an important resource for passively detecting viruses like SARS-CoV-2. Researchers from the Arava Institute’s Center for Transboundary Water Management, including Director of the Center, Dr. Clive Lipchin, and Assistant Director Fareed Mahameed, and Ben-Gurion University of the Negev took advantage of this fact for a research study along the Hebron Stream in the Negev. Their recently published paper concluded that under-testing and asymptomatic transmission in Bedouin communities led to a mismatch between reported coronavirus cases and viral presence in wastewater.

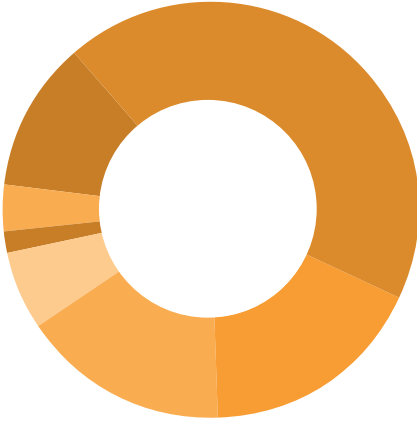
